Chapter Project

One of Delta Rho's favorite projects is our Christmas Bazaar. Delta Rho and Gamma Sigma (DKG chapter in Moore County) meet the first Saturday in December for our annual Christmas Bazaar/Silent Auction/Luncheon. The money made from the silent auction is split between the two chapters. Delta Rho uses the money for our \$1,000 Recruitment Grant-in-Aid scholarship, a scholarship given to a female senior from one of the three high schools in Lee County majoring in education. Since 2008, we have given 14 scholarships. The 2020-2021 recipient was Taylor O'Quinn from Southern Lee.

Each member brings an item for the auction. A variety of items have been brought for the silent auction - plants, pottery, jewelry, gift cards, baskets (chocolate, coffee, wine, tea), scarves, Christmas items, food items (cakes/pies), etc.
